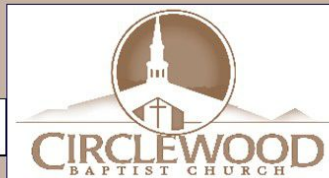

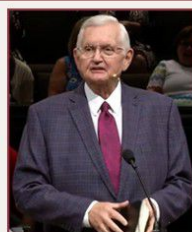
The little boy's gift of sharing was used by Jesus in a mighty way. Always remember to offer God whatever you have. Offer your talents, your things, and your time. God will bless you!
